- Eyes (inspection of conj,lids; exam of pupils, irises; ophthalm. exam)
- Ears, Nose, Mouth, and Throat (ext insp ears, nose; otoscopic exam; assess hearing; insp of nasal mucosa; insp lips,teeth,gums, TMJ; exam of oropharynx)
- Neck (exam of neck for masses, symmetry; exam of thyroid)
- Cardiovascular (palpation; auscultation; exam of carotid; abdom aorta; femoral pulses; pedal pulses)
- Respiratory (resp effort; percussion; palpation; auscultation)
- Abdomen (masses or tenderness; liver and spleen; hernia; anus, rectum, perineum; occult blood)
- Genitourinary (Male - scrotal contents; penis Female - exam of ext genitalia; urethra; bladder; cervix; uterus; adnexa)

Fever without focal findings - suspect new viral illness

Fever without focal findings, need to monitor for persistent fever or new symptoms

notes

Fever without obvious source.

Differential diagnosis includes viral illnesses, but must rule out other potentially serious bacterial infections. Discussed possibility of UTI, occult bacteremia or pneumonia. Do not think findings/hx consistent with meningitis (normal exam/no meningismus/not ill appearing)

Patient Instructions - Sick

- Fever without source - Your child was seen in the office for fever today suspected to be due to viral illness. Continue treating with ibuprofen or acetaminophen as needed for fever and encourage fluids. If the fever doesn't improve in 2-3 days, new symptoms occur, poor fluid intake, worsening fussiness or other concern, your child will need to be reevaluated.
