 Antibiotic - Any antibiotic may cause an allergic reaction. Call if vomiting, rash, or other concern. Call 911 if your child develops shortness of breath, severe shortness of breath, swollen lips or tongue. Side effects of antibiotics include abdominal pain, diarrhea, and/or rash. Call with any questions or concerns.

 Strep - Your child was seen in our office today and diagnosed with a bacterial infection of the throat caused by a bacteria named Group A streptococcus. Treatment goals include treating the infection adequately with antibiotics, making your child feel more comfortable as the infection is treated, and ensuring your child stays well hydrated. Make sure your child completes all antibiotics as prescribed. Encourage fluids. You may give your child acetaminophen or ibuprofen as needed for pain or fever. For dosing instructions, please refer to our website. Your child may return to school when he/she has completed at least 24 hours of antibiotics, has no more fever, and is feeling well enough to participate in regular school activities. Please call our office if your child is not improving in 24 to 48 hours, is having trouble swallowing, drooling, or complaining of worsening sore throat, or you have any other concerns. For more information regarding sore throat, see our sore throat information the provider may have given you.

 Viral pharyngitis with culture - Your child was seen in our office today and diagnosed with a sore throat NOT related to Group A streptococcus, but most likely caused by a virus. However, a culture has been sent to confirm that there is no strep bacteria. You will be notified of the results in several days. Treatment goals include making your child feel more comfortable as the sore throat resolves on its own, and ensuring your child stays well hydrated. Encourage fluids. You may give your child acetaminophen or ibuprofen as needed for pain or fever. For dosing instructions, please refer to our website. Your child has fever for at least 24 hours, and is feeling well



enough to participate in regular school activities. Please call our office if your child is not improving in 24 to 48 hours, is having trouble swallowing, drooling, or complaining of worsening sore throat, or you have any other concerns. For more information regarding sore throat, see our sore throat information the provider may have given you.

- Hand Foot Mouth - Your child has been diagnosed with Hand foot and mouth disease which is a common viral illness. The goals of treatment are to relieve your child's bothersome symptoms. Encourage fluids to prevent dehydration. You may use tylenol or motrin (if over 6 months old) for pain or fever. If has lesions in the mouth they may last about 7 days all other lesions may arise and last around 10 days. Can resume school/daycare as long as is fever free for 24 hours and is not excessively drooling. Call if refusal to take fluids, not urinating at least every 6-8 hours, difficulty swallowing, shortness of breath, fatigue, fever lasting > 72 hours or other concerns.
