


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

Your child has fever for at least 24 hours, and is feeling well enough to participate in regular school activities. Please call our office if your child is not improving in 24 to 48 hours, is having trouble swallowing, drooling, or complaining of worsening sore throat, or you have any other concerns. For more information regarding sore throat, see our sore throat information on our website under medical info - infections. notes Hand Foot Mouth - Your child has been diagnosed with Hand foot and mouth disease which is a common viral illness. The goals of treatment are to relieve your child's bothersome symptoms. Encourage fluids to prevent dehydration. You may use tylenol or motrin (if over 6 months old) for pain or fever. If has lesions in the mouth they may last about 7 days all other lesions may arise and last around 10 days. Can resume school/daycare as long as is fever free for 24 hours and is not excessively drooling.
